Annual Report

2017

Thank you again Holmes County!!! In November 2016 the voters of Holmes County voted to make our roads better by supporting and voting in favor of the ¼% road sales tax. The first year's paving plan was very successful with 28.01 miles of road improved. In addition, we chip and sealed 54.85 miles of roads with our own funds to try and save the roads until the 1/4% road sales tax can improve them.

Financing: Since the sales tax is a year behind, this year we have applied for and received a 0% loan from Ohio Public Works to bring this money forward to continue the improvements. We also received a federal safety grant for \$150,000 for center and edge line striping.

Planning: It is tough to decide each year which roads will be improved with the 1/4% road sales tax. Well..., we have to start somewhere, so we took into account pavement conditions, traffic counts, truck traffic, and also some long term experience/knowledge of how long the roads would last. This is how we determine which roads get improved each year.

After much planning and debate, it was determined to finish CR168-from SR515 to the County Line (2.81 mi.), CR25 (4.77 mi.), CR6 (5.67 mi.), CR245 (2.13 mi.), CR114 (5.30 mi.), CR172 (4.07 mi.) and CR575 (0.94 mi.) for a total of 25.69 miles.

Design: The planned improvement design is the same as last year with the design being an $1\frac{1}{2}$ " asphalt overlay, center lines, edge lines, safety edge and some shoulders. The edge lines will be 6" wide rather than 4" wide. Believe it or not, there have been studies that show just a 2" wider edge line reduces run-off-the-road crashes by 20%.

Prep Work: Pavement will not last if you don't get the water to drain away from the road with adequate ditches. We have been working with our own crews on ditching and berming the roads to be done this year. We are also working to replace/repair culvert crossings and road signage along these routes. In a couple weeks we will also be performing some structural repairs by grinding and patching. We don't want to just cover up the problem underneath the new/nice overlay for it to come back as potholes the following years. We want these roads to last as long as they can!

Bidding: We plan to bid the project in the next couple of weeks with a bid opening date of June 18th and starting work the second week of July if everything proceeds according to plan.

In addition to the 28.01 miles improved in year 1 and the planned 25.69 miles this year, we still have another 196.30 miles of roads and 283 bridges to take care of and try to get them in the best shape we can. It was a tough and long winter and we had some strong thunderstorms early spring that put us behind. We have been working overtime to try to get caught up on patching the potholes and fixing washouts/cleaning ditches. We also have 6 bridge replacements planned for this year. With limited staff and budget this is almost an impossible task, but I know the Holmes County Highway Department Staff will try their best to get the job done. Thank you again Holmes County!!!

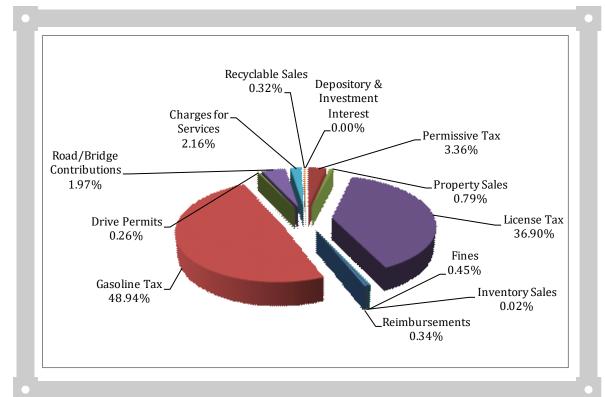

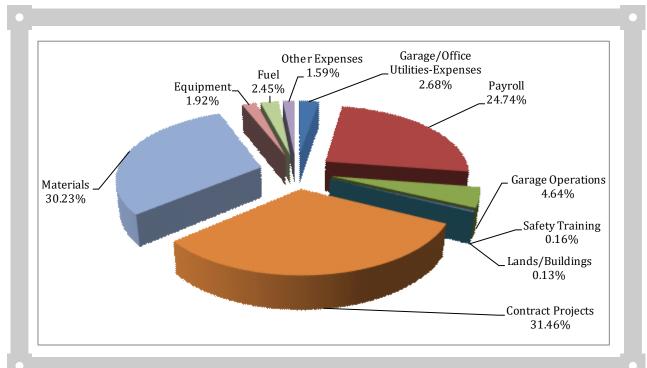

Melway Paving was awarded the project as the lowest and best qualified bidder, and performed the work at a cost of \$2,403,940.46. The Holmes County Highway Department performed the preparation work, such as grinding and patching on the roads that were to be resurfaced. The cost of the grinding was \$92,528.46. The cost of the patching was \$264,925.44. These preparation costs were from local funding, and include equipment, labor, and material. The total overall cost of the project was \$2,761,394.36.

The total cost of the project includes; resurfacing, berming, centerline striping, and edge line striping. To allow the resurfacing project to commence at an appropriate time, all project costs were financed through an ODOT SIB loan, which will begin to be reimbursed once the 0.25% sales tax revenue is received.
